Read this Guide very carefully, fill out the checklist, and bring the completed checklist to Mrs. Pauli in the College and Career Center Office to pick up the applications. Your checklist will determine the number of applications you need to fill out (one for each check you have on the checklist). Do not fill out the checklist if you have questions. Questions specific to your academic record should be directed to your counselor; general questions about scholarships listed in the Guide can be asked of Mrs. Pauli. It would be wise to pick up applications before Christmas break so you have ample time to fill them out. Because not all scholarship committees interview, it is important that you fill the application out neatly and accurately. Remember, the completed applications AND the checklist are due to Mrs. Pauli by January 27, 2017.

December 5, 2016 **FINANCIAL AID / SCHOLARSHIP NIGHT** – This meeting for seniors and their parents starts at 7:00 PM in the high schools’ auditorium. General information on financial aid and scholarships will be discussed.

January 27, 2017 **COMPLETED APPLICATIONS AND THE CHECKLIST DUE** – Applications AND checklists are to be turned in to Mrs. Pauli.

March 13 - 17, 2017 **SCHOLARSHIP INTERVIEWS** – The Ziegler Family Foundation, the Rolfs Educational Foundation, and COLUMNS interview teams will interview on these days. All students who apply for scholarships in this Guide will automatically be considered candidates for the COLUMNS scholarships and will be interviewed. Specific information regarding your interview date and time will be sent to you around March 1st. You are responsible for checking on your interview date with Mrs. Pauli in the College and Career Center Office if you do not receive a letter. Early graduates are especially reminded to check your interview date and time by calling Mrs. Pauli at 262-335-5405.

March 2017 **OTHER INTERVIEWS** – Students who apply for the Partners of St. Joseph’s Community Hospital and the Partners and St. Joseph’s Hospital Volunteer Scholarships will also be interviewed. Representatives of these scholarships will select the students they wish to interview. If you are selected to interview, you will be notified of the date, time and place. These interviews usually take place around the same time as the other interviews.

April 2017 **SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS NOTIFIED**

May 1, 2017 **SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM** – Scholarship recipients will be honored on Monday, May 1, 2017 at 7:00 PM, in the high schools’ auditorium, The Silver Lining Art Center. Family and friends are invited to attend.

Local scholarships provided by industries, organizations, and individuals are not restricted to students pursuing four-year college programs. Many scholarships are open to students who plan to enroll in technical programs (business, cosmetology, nursing, auto mechanics, x-ray technology, etc.). Some scholarship programs have restrictions regarding rank in class; some stress financial need as one of the major criteria. Grades in special interest areas are important! Applicants for technical scholarships are urged to submit a letter of recommendation from a teacher in his/her major area. Usually, a local scholarship will not be awarded to a person who has received another substantial scholarship. Be sure to include all information asked for by the scholarship organization (letters of recommendation, essays, etc.). Seniors who have credits from UWVC are to submit a transcript with their applications.

Scholarship recipients are selected by the organizations offering the scholarship, **not** by any high school staff member. The high schools provide the information the committees ask for to aid them in making a decision (i.e., grade point averages, test scores, etc.). Our scholarship coordinator, Mrs. Pauli, will reserve the rooms needed for the interviews, will schedule appointment dates and times for the students, and will inform the students and the scholarship committees of the interview schedule.

Each scholarship is designated **Technical, Academic, or Technical or Academic.**

ACADEMIC Students who are planning to pursue a four-year college program are eligible. Applicants to UWVC should also apply.

TECHNICAL Students who are planning to pursue a program that is up to a two-year time frame are eligible. All programs qualify whether they are offered at technical colleges, business schools, beauty schools, hospital schools of nursing, etc.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

1. Be sure to include a letter of recommendation if requested by the scholarship organization.
2. Technical applicants are encouraged to submit a letter of recommendation.
3. Be sure to include an essay if requested by the scholarship organization.
4. Staple a copy of your Volunteer Service Program Report to each of your completed applications. All volunteer hours submitted to Mrs. Olson by Friday, January 13 will be listed on your report. Ask her to run an official report no later than Thursday, January 19 so you can staple it to all your applications.
5. Seniors with UWVC credit should submit a transcript with their applications if they are not taking classes through Youth Options. Youth Options credits will show up on your transcript from the high schools.
6. Applications AND the checklists are to be turned in to Mrs. Pauli in the College and Career Center Office by January 27, 2017.
7. Interview dates are March 13 - 17, 2017.
8. Students will be informed of their interview date and time sometime around March 1st. If you do not receive a letter, it is your responsibility to see Mrs. Pauli in the College and Career Center Office to check on your interview date.
9. Early graduates are also responsible for checking on the interview dates and times by calling Mrs. Pauli at 335-5405.

ZIEGLER FAMILY FOUNDATION FUND**ACADEMIC**

Eligibility: Upper 5% of class and must have attended at least their last two years of high school at the West Bend High Schools.

Five (5) scholarships are offered in the amount of \$7,500 per year; one scholarship is awarded at East High School, one is awarded at West High School, and three are awarded at large to a graduate of either high school. The awards shall be made for one year only, but with the provision that they may be continued for the duration of a 4-year (8 semester maximum) college course of study leading to an undergraduate degree if objective and non-discriminatory renewal criteria are maintained. To be eligible, applicants must have attended at least their last two years of high school in West Bend and rank in the upper 5% of their class. The primary basis for the awards should be the qualities of leadership the candidate has shown in school and in the community. The scholarship must commence in the year it is awarded. If a family has a Ziegler scholar in an undergraduate program, another brother or sister will not be eligible for the Ziegler Scholarship.

ROLFS EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION**ACADEMIC**

Eligibility: Upper third of the class, demonstrate need, and attendance at a 4 year institution

The ROLFS EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION will be awarding two (2) scholarships each year. The scholarship is \$7000 a year, renewable for the duration of a four year college program, providing the recipient's grades and conduct are satisfactory to the scholarship committee.

In addition, the Foundation will also offer a scholarship not to exceed \$2,500 one-time award. Special consideration for this scholarship will be given to a Pathways student.

NORBERT J. FAHEY MEMORIAL**ACADEMIC**

Eligibility: Upper 10% of class and must have attended at least their last two years of high school at the West Bend High Schools.

The West Bend Clinic Scholarship Fund will award two (2) \$6,250 scholarships. One scholarship will be offered to an East graduate and one to a West graduate. This scholarship is offered for one year and will be renewable for four (4) years provided grades, progress towards degree fulfillment, and conduct satisfactory to the West Bend Clinic Scholarship Fund committee are maintained. Leadership abilities and school and community service and activities are also considered. The scholarship recipient may attend any accredited 4-year university or college and pursue any course of study.

OSCAR C. & AUGUSTA SCHLEGEL FOUNDATION**ACADEMIC**

Eligibility: Upper 15% of class and must have attended at least their last two years of high school at the West Bend High Schools.

Two \$16,000 scholarships (\$2,000 per semester) will be awarded by the Oscar C. & Augusta Schlegel Foundation. One will be awarded to an East High School student and one will be awarded to a West High School student. Service to school and community shall be given strong consideration. The student must maintain a satisfactory college grade point average of at least a 2.5. This is a COLUMNS administered scholarship and the COLUMNS Interview Committee will interview students. A separate application is not required.

SUDER-PICK**ACADEMIC OR TECHNICAL**

Eligibility: High academic achievement with a firm career goal.

The Suder-Pick Scholarships are awarded to students of the West Bend High Schools, giving due consideration to academic achievement, extracurricular activities, community involvement and financial need, with preference to students who have a definite goal, profession or career as an objective for his or her higher education. It is the Suder-Pick Foundation's hope that West Bend High School seniors aided by the scholarship program will become productive and active citizens who will give back to their community through their talents and good works. The scholarship assistance must be used at an accredited college, university or trade school. This is a COLUMNS administered scholarship and the COLUMNS Interview Committee will interview students. A separate application is not required. Four \$16,000 scholarships will be awarded.

PARTNERS OF ST. JOSEPH'S COMMUNITY HOSPITAL**ACADEMIC**

Eligibility: 3.75 GPA; pursuing a degree in health-related field.

Two \$7,500 scholarships will be offered to seniors of West Bend East, West Bend West, Kewaskum, or Slinger High Schools who maintained a 3.75 grade point average during high school and who will be pursuing a degree in a health-related field. The student must continue to pursue this major. The initial grant of \$1,875 per student per year will be renewable for four years upon presentation of acceptable grades at the end of each semester. In the event of a large number of applicants, a preliminary screening will be done and interviews granted accordingly.

PARTNERS OF ST. JOSEPH'S HOSPITAL VOLUNTEER**ACADEMIC**

Eligibility: 3.5 GPA; 100 volunteer hours at hospital; pursuing a medical field of study

One \$2,000 scholarship will be offered to a senior of West Bend East, West Bend West, Kewaskum, or Slinger High Schools who maintain a 3.5 grade point average during high school and who will be pursuing a medical field of study post-high school graduation. A teen volunteer must have 100 cumulative hours volunteering at St. Joseph's Hospital and have been a Volunteer for a minimum of two (2) consecutive years. Students will be considered if they are in the upper 15% of their graduating class with a minimum 27 ACT score and a strong concentration within the math and science curriculums.

WEST BEND CHILDREN'S THEATRE, INC.**ACADEMIC OR TECHNICAL**

Eligibility: Interest & ability in the performing arts; letter of reference.

Two or more \$1,000 scholarships (\$500/semester for 1 year) will be awarded to East and/or West seniors who have shown an interest and ability in the performing arts (drama, music, dance, stage design, etc.). An adequate grade point average is necessary for each payment. **You must submit a letter of reference from the drama or music coach.**

WEST BEND MASONIC LODGE

ACADEMIC OR TECHNICAL

Eligibility: Academic achievement and community involvement and service.

The West Bend Masonic Lodge/Wentdorf Memorial is offering one \$2,000 scholarship (\$500 per year, renewable for four years) to a graduating senior at each high school. The intent of this award is to honor academic achievement and community involvement and service to a student who exhibits potential for future achievement, leadership, and success.

WEST BEND MUTUAL INSURANCE COMPANY

ACADEMIC

Eligibility: School and community service activities with a 3.0 or better GPA.

A \$10,000 scholarship (\$1,250 paid the first semester and renewable for 7 additional semesters) shall be awarded to either an East or West graduating senior who has maintained a GPA of 3.0 or better at the time of high school graduation. The student must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 when in college in order to retain the scholarship. School and community service activities will be given strong consideration. Financial need will be considered. This is a COLUMNS administered scholarship and the COLUMNS Interview Committee will interview students. A separate application is not required.



Dedicated to the development of academic-degree and vocational-technical scholarships, West Bend COLUMNS is a uniquely local program.

COLUMNS was created in 1972 when the West Bend Community High Schools Alumni Foundation (1962) and the West Bend Scholarship Fund (1965) merged into the West Bend Community and Alumni Scholarship Foundation, Inc. Both organizations existed with the same purpose of providing financial aid to worthy West Bend High School students.

Funds are provided through the generosity of friends and alumni of the West Bend High Schools. COLUMNS offers scholarships from its own fund and it administers a number of awards sponsored by individuals, families and organizations in the community.

Awards are granted in both college (academic) and vocational / technical fields. Listed on the following pages are the scholarships either provided by or administered by or interviewed by COLUMNS. Each description provides a brief history of the scholarship as well as the eligibility qualifications. All students who apply for scholarships listed on the following pages will be interviewed by COLUMNS. The COLUMNS interview committee will determine which scholarships you are eligible for based on the information included in the application and further information offered during the interview. Since some scholarships are chosen based on school choice or career plans, note that if those plans change, the scholarship may be forfeited.

Be sure to fill out the application form carefully and completely and include any attachments that may be required (for example, letters of recommendations, essays, etc.) **Only one (1) application form needs to be filled out for all scholarships listed under COLUMNS. However, you must submit two (2) copies of that completed application in addition to the original.**

Applicants must have attended at least their last two years of education in the West Bend High Schools in order to be considered.

COLUMNS Technical Scholarships

DAN BECKER MEMORIAL

This scholarship is offered in memory of Dan Becker, a 1979 West Bend East graduate.

Qualifications: Planning to attend a vocational / technical school

JOE AND WIN HUBER MEMORIAL

This scholarship is in memory of Joe and Win Huber who passed away in 2011 and 2001, respectively. Mr. Huber was a lifelong resident of West Bend. Throughout his life he maintained a commitment of service to country, community, and family. Mrs. Huber was a driving force in family education. She worked as a tutor for home-bound children.

ANDREW J. PICK MEMORIAL

This scholarship is in memory of Andy Pick, who was a 1970 graduate of West Bend High School. Andy had an active high school career, serving as president of his senior class and captain of the swim team. He went on to study at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill until his untimely and tragic death at age 20 while airborne following a vacation in Thailand.

FRANK AND BETTY PLISCHOUNIG MEMORIAL

This scholarship was established in memory of Frank and Betty Plischounig, who operated Plischounig's retail store in West Bend from 1938 to 1966. Betty was the first woman to become a member of the West Bend Businessman's Association.

BOYS AND GIRLS CLUBS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY

ACADEMIC OR TECHNICAL

Eligibility: A Washington County high school senior who is a Boys and Girls Club active member with plans of pursuing either a technical or college degree.

This scholarship will be awarded to a student who demonstrates a positive attitude towards their future goals and makes continued contributions to the Boys and Girls Club. The scholarship will be awarded in the amount of one \$1,000 scholarship per year, per recipient, for up to 4 years based on scholarship criteria. THE SCHOLARSHIP INTERVIEW

The following scholarship committees will be conducting personal interviews: Ziegler Family Foundation Fund, Rolfs Educational Foundation, Norbert J. Fahey Memorial Scholarship, COLUMNS, Partners of St. Joseph's Community Hospital, and the Partners of St. Joseph's and Volunteer Program. The first four committees will interview together so you will be meeting with as many as 8-10 people at the time of your interview; the last two committees will select the students to be interviewed and interview information will be sent out to just those students. All interview committees choose their recipients.

We realize that many applicants are more effective than others in an interview situation because they are able to talk freely about their accomplishments, service to school and community, and plans for the future. The following guidelines may help you:

- Think about the message you send by the way you dress
- Be prepared to "sell yourself"
- Maintain eye contact
- Discuss any honors or awards you have won
- Expect to expand on information you have on your application.
- Use proper English (i.e., yes instead of ya, tons of things or stuff (be specific), umm's, received instead of have gotten, etc.).
- Use humor when appropriate
- Be ready to elaborate on your career goals
- Practice answering questions with your parents or friends
- Be prepared to discuss:
 - What you have done to prepare for your future (courses, jobs, volunteer work, etc.)
 - The estimated cost of your education
 - How you plan to meet those expenses
 - Any experiences you have had which relate to your chosen career

Be sure to thank the committee for their time at the end of your interview.

Students are reminded NOT to make vacation plans or college visit plans between March 13 - 17, as these are the only dates that scholarship committees will be interviewing. If you are not in school these days, you will not be part of the interview process for scholarships.
